Fiddlesticks is an Irish pub with maybe the best brunch I have encountered in Manhattan. For only \$10.00, you get two cocktails plus a delicious entrée. At twice the price, this still would be worth it.

I had the Smoked Salmon Omelette with Irish smoked salmon, red onions, capers, and cream cheese. It is served with delicious potatoes and toast. A perfect brunch dish. One of my dining companions ordered off the brunch menu and chose the Irish Beef Stew, a generous serving of tender meat and vegetables in a savory brown sauce. He loved it and, from what I tasted, I could not blame him.

During the week, Fiddlesticks offers a \$9.00 lunch which does not include cocktails but comes with choice of soup or salad and choice of such entrees as the aforementioned stew, turkey burger, bangers and mash, and Cajun chicken sandwich.

The service was absolutely charming and very Irish – when my friend Bob asked how the stew was, one of our waitresses, in a beautiful brogue, said, “The stew is gorgeous!”

Fiddlesticks, which used to be the popular gay bar Uncle Charlie’s, is a solid bet for lunch, brunch, and I am sure dinner. To paraphrase our waitress, everything here is gorgeous!
